

FRIENDSHIP GROUPS



ELDERS

Elder Meeting Minutes September 16, 2024

The September Elder's meeting was called to order with the following elders present: Harry Harris, Fred Holland, Paul Cook, Jerry Benware and Roger Brown. Presenters attending: Chairman of the Deacons, Michael Bolter; and Church Administrator, Chris Callahan.

Roger presented the meditation and opening prayer.

The August minutes were accepted and approved.

The Deacon's report was presented by Michael. Personal testimonies, training, event scheduling and support as well as visitation ministry involvement are all continuing with excellent results. Michael shared that Lou DeLucio was selected as the Deacon of the month. We currently have nineteen serving deacons.

The August Administrative report was presented by Chris. The financial report was approved. Chris provided his monthly update on the current status of Phase 1 FORWARD Initiative Campaign pledges, with receipts still on track. The Phase 2 funding support currently has one hundred and four formal pledges totaling a little over \$315,000. We continue to pray for reaching the \$1 Million mark in Phase 2 pledges before the end of the first quarter of 2025, with funds received by the end of the calendar year 2025. The overview of ongoing building actions included continued work on new men's restroom, ministry storage rooms, and preparation for pouring the foundations for the expanded exterior additions. The Building Leadership Team is working on reviewing and selecting material samples for carpet, tile, and other interior finish elements. Chris shared that the Ministry Fair was a great success with a large number of attendees, including many first-time attenders to our church. Planning efforts are in process for the development of next year's budget. Ministry leaders are providing input to support a draft for Elder review in October.

The Preaching Minister's Report was provided in writing for update on the ministerial staff activities for the month. Much work continues in support of classes, visitations, outreach, and coordination with tri-county Christian organizations. Planning for holiday activities is ongoing.

Under Old Business, ongoing efforts to update the church by-laws and the organizational chart were discussed.

Under New Business, planning for next year's Valentine Dinner scheduled for February was discussed. Also, the incident with the Mexico Mission Team was discussed and the elders are looking forward to a debrief on this and input from the Missions Committee on future trips to Mexico. Harry provided the closing prayer.

The next monthly Elders meeting is scheduled for October 21st.

Marlene Wilkie, a part of the ministry team, sent me a note sharing how that event went.

It was a total success (as always), however this time we found all the veterans were new. Some just didn't want to come in because of either PTSD or fear of not knowing what we were doing (just serving and spending time). But the Lord was at work through what we were able to do. We sat and ate during dinner and shared conversations with the veterans. They were all very thankful, made to go plates for their buddies and left by giving us a lovely thank you card. Those are the reasons we continue to spend time and bring Jesus to their hearts.

Amen! God bless our wonderful veterans and God bless our various ministry teams making a difference in people's lives!
