

ELDERS

Elder Meeting Minutes JANUARY 20, 2025

The January Elder's meeting was called to order with the following elders present: Harry Harris, Roger Brown, Paul Cook, Fred Holland and Jerry Benware. Presenters attending: Preaching Minister, Butch Gastfield; Chairman of the Deacons, Michael Bolter; and Church Administrator, Chris Callahan.

Jerry presented the meditation and opening prayer.

The December minutes were accepted and approved.

The Deacon's report was presented by Michael. He said that the deacons will start a short study on the Restoration Movement. Tom Ross has scheduled an initial meeting with the Emergency Response Team which includes several deacons and other volunteers as a part of this ministry. Michael mentioned the parking lot team continues to need additional help. The Men's Breakfast was well supported as well as all the Women's Ministry events which are covered through June. The church policy dealing with Deacons has been updated and Michael is in the process of review. Chris shared that the church is planning an appreciation dinner for the Deacons and their wives.

The administrative report was presented by Chris. The December (2024 year-end) financial report was reviewed and approved. The FORWARD pledge numbers were reviewed and it appears that about 90% of the funds pledged have been received. We continue to pray for additional pledges to assist in reaching our \$1 Million mark for Phase 2 pledges which would be due by July 31st. The elders are planning to provide an update on the current Building Project during each of the services about mid-February. Chris provided a detailed update on the status of construction which can be seen throughout the church. Given the progress, there may be some restrictions on our classrooms and possibly the Fellowship Hall during the coming months, so flexibility and coordination will be critical for all the church family.

The Preaching Minister's Report was provided by Butch to include an update on the ministerial staff activities for the month. He recapped the events that occurred during December and they were a great success in spite of the construction concerns. Everyone has been very cooperative and considerate in minimizing the challenges we are facing with all the construction ongoing. He highlighted the three Wednesday night teaching sessions with Dr. Grady McMurtry; what a wonderful opportunity to hear from a world-renowned Creationist expert. He mentioned that February and March will provide a variety of sermons from our associate ministers, Butch and special guests. He provided detailed overviews of all the activities of our associate ministers and noted a number of exciting upcoming events in February and March. Butch shared a detailed update on the progress of the Unity Christian Church plant in Leesburg. Information on this will be provided In the mid-February elder update to the church family.

Under Old Business, several Missions Committee issues were discussed to include the Lake Aurora (Feb 24-26) and Appalachia (with CrossRoads, Jun 22-28) trips which were approved as a matter of record. Butch described the idea of hosting the annual Christian Restoration Association conference here at FCC next year; more information was requested.

Under New Business, a brief list of internal action items were discussed and assigned to various elders and ministers to pursue.

Fred provided the closing prayer.

The next monthly Elders meeting is scheduled for February 17th.



9:00 am

Hope, Holiness, and Heaven; A Study of 1st Peter Taught by Kevin White

First Peter gives us a divine perspective on living as strangers in a world that is increasingly hostile to the gospel of Jesus Christ. One of the key themes in Peter's letter to "God's elect" is that suffering is often a very real part of the Christian experience. His letter counsels and comforts us in times of adversity and affliction by pointing us to the living hope we have in our relationship with Christ.
