# **ELDERS**

#### ELDER MEETING MINUTES DECEMBER 16, 2024

The December Elder's meeting was called to order with the following elders present: Harry Harris, Fred Holland, Paul Cook, Jerry Benware and Roger Brown. Presenters attending: the Preaching Minister, Butch Gastfield; Church Administrator, Chris Callahan; and Chairman of the Deacons, Michael Bolter.

Chris presented the opening meditation and prayer.

The November minutes were accepted and approved.

Michael presented the Deacon's report. He shared that deacons have fulfilled all requests for the months of January through June 2025. Additionally, he stated that Tom Ross gave an excellent update on the details of the Emergency Response Team for each service and he has begun to recruit volunteers to fill the positions. Michael noted that Gerald Raver provided an update on the parking lot ministry, highlighting that in spite of the substantial number of people attending the Big Band concert, using lots of innovation, the parking challenge was completed without incident. He also noted that a few more members are needed to support the parking lot ministry, especially with the growing number of attendees at all our services. Michael mentioned that the past thirty days were very busy but all requirements were met joyfully by our deacons. They continue to flourish with servant's attitudes and discipleship growth, participating in bible studies and other ministry support.

Chris presented the Administrative report. The November financial report was approved. The discussion of the FORWARD Campaign resulted in agreement that an update should be provided to the congregation in January. In line with that, Chris noted that significant pledges remain to be completed by April to meet the goals reported for PHASE 1 but we expect them to be fulfilled by the end of April. The PHASE 2 funding support remains at 107 formal pledges totaling almost \$320,000, which represents about one-third of our target goal of one million dollars. We continue to pray that 2025 will start with new commitments for this. The congregation approved the 2025 church budget and the elders will evaluate the recap of our budget performance for 2024 during the January Elders Meeting. Chris mentioned that it is evident that much progress is being made on the construction of the church expansion project and so far, the contractor appears to be on schedule and within cost. He further mentioned that updates are regularly posted on the church website.

The Preaching Minister's Report was presented by Butch. The monthly written reports submitted by each of the Associate Ministers were also provided for elder review. Butch noted that Dr. Grady McMurtry will present a variety of Creation topics the last three Wednesday evenings in January, with each class scheduled from 6 – 7:30 PM. Butch also mentioned that the Missions Committee will provide a Wednesday evening overview of their 2024 activities the second week of January. He highlighted the success of all our Christmas concerts and reminded the board of the Unity Christian Church (our church plant) update and children's chorus presentation on the 18th and the Christmas Eve service scheduled for the 24th. He provided an update on the progress of the Connecting Hearts ministry and scheduled planning meetings with the ministry staff on that. Butch mentioned that much activity is coming for 2025 and we are all excited by the wonderful possibilities God has provided In this church.

Under Old Business, the bimonthly Elders and Ministers meeting is scheduled for Monday, January 27, 2025. It was noted that the organizational chart update is posted on the website. The draft "Qualifications for Deacon Document" was reviewed and noted that once finalized, should be used for all positions of leadership service throughout the church. More to come on this document. The elders reviewed the feedback provided on the Big Band Concert and the "Agnus Dei" cantata presented this month. Attendance for each was phenomenal and feedback was extremely positive.

Under New Business, the Elders discussed several critical prayer requests and reviewed the staff vacation schedule for the remainder of the year.

The meeting was closed in prayer by Jerry.

The next monthly Elders meeting is scheduled for January 20, 2025.

Thomas Glapion's culinary talents and dedication have touched the lives of many at Fairway. A long-time volunteer, Thomas has been the cornerstone of the Men's Prayer Breakfast meals for eight years. His example is one of service, passion, and commitment.

Saturday morning the aroma of grilled eggs, hash browns, biscuits and gravy fills the air at Fairway's kitchen. This is when men come together in fellowship, prayer, and to share a breakfast that Thomas has planned the menu, done the shopping, organized and trained a kitchen team to make it all work smoothly. What started as a simple act of volunteering quickly turned into a mission.

Thomas' impact extends beyond serving as the Executive Chef in the kitchen. His calm demeanor and encouraging words create an inviting atmosphere, making the Fellowship Hall a welcoming space for all. Many men look forward to chats with Thomas during breakfast preparation, as he often serves as the chief story teller sharing tales of his military and law enforcement service.
